# Visit from Wonder Dome

On Monday, in relation to their topic 'Planets', Year 5 had an exciting visit from Wonder Dome. The children stepped through the zip entrance of a spectacular dome-shaped planetarium, and were immersed in a 360-degree projection of space, unveiling the vast wonders of the Universe. They journeyed through the formation of planets, the birth and death of stars, rocket launches, and the dream of setting foot on distant worlds. The experience sparked their curiosity and deepened their fascination with space exploration.



#### French and Music

In French, Year 3 have been learning about *les instruments*. To bring their learning to life, Mrs. Cheung, our music teacher, brought in two (*deux*) of our ten (*dix*) instruments to demonstrate to the pupils. The students really enjoyed listening to *la harpe* and *la clarinette*. This was a fantastic way to reinforce the vocabulary they have been practising in French.

#### Year 6 local walk

On Wednesday, Year 6 embarked on a fascinating exploration of local Victorian architecture. Elijah and Marco from Harriers shared how, in small groups with their teacher, they surveyed various buildings, identifying classic Victorian features such as stained glass windows, patterned brickwork, tiled porch floors, and chimney stacks.

In total, they observed over twenty buildings dating back to the mid-1800s. A highlight of the walk was studying the old Northgate School, built in 1839, where they were surprised to find separate entrances for boys and girls. As part of their learning, the class has also been comparing Victorian maps with modern-day ones to understand how the area has evolved over time.

#### EYFS/KS1 School Council Bake off

Yesterday was the EYFS/KS1 School Council Bake off! There was some fantastic bakes so thank you to everyone that participated. The cakes were judged by members of the School Council on their imagination, decoration and taste.
