#### **Headteacher's News**

Our school's attendance figures are currently just slightly below the national attendance figure (96.7%), which is unusual and worrying. Attendance at school is very important for children and can have a detrimental effect on their achievement levels. about her life, where she explained the importance of believing in yourself, learning as much as you can and embracing who we are and where we come from. # **Enriching the Curriculum-Black History Month**

On Monday, 'The Investigator' Andrew Muhammd, a leading black history and cultural specialist, ran interactive workshops for Year 4, 5 and 6. In his energetic presentations, he discussed the history and achievements of our culturally diverse society, starting with the civilizations of Ancient Egypt, and including Sundiata Keita of the Malian Empire, whose life story was the inspiration for The Lion King. They also looked at Mansa Musa the richest man whoever lived, who just dripped with gold! The children enjoyed a quiz based on national dress and world foods. Mr Muhammad said he was very impressed with our children and their high knowledge of ancient history. He thought that they were great ambassadors for Northgate. We greatly appreciate the parents who visited

classes this week. Teni's father, who is of

Nigerian heritage, wore his Hula cap and read a story to Sparrows class called, "Femi the Fox and a Pot of Jollof". Kyan's mum came in to speak to the children about Diwali, the Hindu festival, and Ivy's dad visited Year 6 to read his new book, "Little Brit and the Jungle Kings", which is a story with a moral about building a world bound by respect. Children across the school produced some wonderful art work and writing based on a range of inspirational people.
