The first phase, the sensory room, is almost complete and many children have already been able to use the space. The sensory room is fully equipped with an infinity tunnel, projected light show, bubble tube, fibre optics, and sensory soft play resources. It has been greatly appreciated by chil-




dren with sensory needs or children who have needed to have a calming space. The children love the room and have made comments such as, 'This is the most amazing thing I have ever seen!', 'This room makes me happy!', 'It gets 10 out of 10 and a thumbs up for me!'.
