Safeguarding

Online support: Childnet provide a range of help, advice and resources for parents, carers, teachers, professionals and young people. Their website is full of free resources. What is a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)?

Each school must have appropriate senior members of staff to take lead responsibility for child protection. Key aspects of the 'Designated Safeguarding Lead' role include: referring any concerns to social care, ensuring all staff are aware how to raise safeguarding concerns, ensuring all staff understand the symptoms of child abuse and neglect, monitoring children of concern, maintaining child protection records, raising awareness of the school's safeguarding policies and procedures, and ensuring they are implemented and reviewed regularly.

At Northgate the DSLs are Mrs Tanner, Mrs Clynes, Mrs Layer, Mrs Wallace and Mrs Shepherd.

Enriching the Curriculum—Sport

Three new after-school clubs started this week with Miss Beales, our new PE Apprentice. Miss Beales has always had a keen passion for sport – both from participating herself and from her studies, and is realising her dream of a career working with children in a sporting environment. She is thoroughly enjoying her time working at Northgate and seeing the benefits that sporting activity and teamwork brings to the children.

On Mondays there is a football club for Year 1/2, which is a great way to help children develop basic football skills whilst building their ability and confidence - on and off the pitch.

Year 3/4 children have Tri Golf on Tuesdays, which is a fun and energetic version of golf. Tri-Golf is a genuinely inclusive sport as it suits players of all abilities, including complete novices. Every child can succeed in this game with individual play and team interaction!

Thursday is Basketball club for Y5/6. This game can help children develop a range of skills plus they can also learn to play in competitive games where they can assess their own and others' performance.

Please be aware that the deadline for applications to secondary schools is fast approaching. Parents will need to make an application online or on paper by the <u>closing date of Thursday 31st October 2024</u>. We do recommend that you apply earlier than the deadline in case you have any problems, as the helpline gets extremely busy towards the closing date. Parents should apply online at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions or Alternatively, if you cannot access the internet, you can request a printed version of the website information and application form from the Hertfordshire County Council Customer Service Centre by calling 0300 123 4043.
