Enriching the Curriculum

Geography Field Trip

On Tuesday, as part of their topic on the local environment, Year 5 students went on a geography field trip to Stortford Fields. During the trip, they observed, measured, recorded, and presented various human and physical features of the local area. Using a range of techniques, including sketching maps, examining plans, and creating graphs, they explored the environment in detail.

At the end of Hensman Close, the children sketched a row of residential buildings, labelling the different types of houses they observed. They were encouraged to consider who might live there and what facilities residents would need nearby. The

students demonstrated excellent effort, using a variety of skills to analyse and document the geographical information they gathered. Please see brilliant sketches by Otis and Chloe in Kestrels.



In English, Year 3 have been reading 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' by Roald Dahl and were tasked with creating their own magical sweets or Wonka

bars for homework. They designed treats with exciting names,
