Topic

Our first topic is Stargazers. This is a science based topic. We will be learning about how the planets orbit the sun and how the moon orbits the Earth. The children will learn why day and night occur. This topic will also include a trip to a local observatory. Our history this term will focus on the 1960s Space Race. In English, we will be writing newspaper reports about the 1969 moon landing and a setting description of a fictional planet. Our art topic focuses on the use of watercolours and we will be creating pictures of planets.

After half term we will continue with the Space topic. Within this, our science topic will change to forces. We will learn about how force is measured and we will do lots of investigations linked to magnetism, air resistance, water resistance and friction. In English, children will be creating their own fictional planet and use this as a setting for a quest story. Our DT topic will focus on using mechanisms, learning about how electricity is used to drive products by designing and making our own moon buggies.

PE Kit

PE lessons are on Mondays and Fridays. On these days, children will need to come to school in their PE kit. In Spring 1, we will be practising gymnastics and netball. In Autumn 2, we will be taking part in tennis and invasion games.



Home Learning

Home learning will be set every Friday and be due in the following Friday. An overview and any resources needed will be uploaded to Google Classroom. Please speak to the class teacher if you require a paper copy.

- Maths and English tasks will be set on alternate weeks. Maths tasks will be completed on Mathletics and English tasks on Google Forms.
- Every week, your child will have ten spellings to practise based on the 'Read, Write, Inc' spelling scheme. These will be tested the following Friday.
- Tables up to 12 x 12 should be practised on a weekly basis.

Your child will bring home a school library book every day. They are expected to read at home three times a week for at least 15 minutes. In order to help them increase their vocabulary and deepen their understanding of the text. If your child is a fluent reader, please talk to them about the vocabulary and check their understanding of the text. This should be recorded in their reading record. Age appropriate books from home may be brought in to read.

Maths

This term children will be working on fractions. This will include understanding improper fractions and mixed numbers, adding and subtracting fractions and multiplying fractions. Lessons will have a variety of arithmetic and fluency practice as well as problem solving and reasoning activities.

Reading KS2

In class, we will be reading a range of texts including books linked to our Space topic. Our guided reading books are The Cosmic Diary of Our Incredible Universe by Tim Peake and Cosmic its One Giant Leap for Boy-Kind. Please ensure your child's reading record is in school daily so they can be used for communication about reading progress.
