Headteacher's News

This half term's assembly theme is **kindness**, which is part of our new school code. We explored how simple acts can create a big impact in our school and community. Throughout the month, we'll be learning about what kindness looks like, why it matters, and encourage this to guide everyone's thinking and behaviour. We will consider how small gestures can make a world of difference. We will encourage everyone to think about how they can show kindness and make it a habit that spreads positivity. This half-term, our learning power is **Reflective Learner Lion**. Through discussions about having a growth mindset, we are encouraging children to embrace 'marvelous mistakes' as opportunities to learn and grow. Key skills we're developing include: taking responsibility for our own learning, being open to trying things in different ways, and staying motivated to improve. If your child is struggling with something, you, as parents, can support this journey by using the phrase, "You can't do it yet!" to remind children that persistence and practice lead to progress. Together, we can help children reflect on their learning and build resilience and confidence for the future. This term, **Reception** has been diving into their exciting topic, **"Children of the World,"** and their focus this week is on the vibrant country of **Australia!**



The children have been learning about the geography of the country, its flag, different amazing animals on the continent and making their own aboriginal painting. This week, they explored a classic Australian children's party treat: **Angel (or Fairy) Bread.** Following a simple recipe, the children had a great time spreading butter onto slices of white bread and decorating them with colourful **hundreds and thousands.** This hands-on activity was enjoyed by everyone, especially the part

where they got to taste their creations!

This week, Year 1 have been exploring the work of the French Modernist artist Piet Mondrian (1872–1944). The children have been learning all about his signature style, characterised by bold primary colours, clean black lines, and geometric shapes. Using Mondrian's paintings as inspiration, the children practised drawing and painting in his unique style creating their own stunning masterpieces. The children's work is absolutely brilliant!





During their science lesson today, Year 3 ex-

plored the fascinating world of rocks by investigating their **permeability**. The experiment involved placing different types of rocks into water and observing if any **bubbles** emerged. The presence of bubbles indicates air escaping as water fills the tiny spaces within the rock—showing how **permeable** it is. The more bubbles, the more permeable the rock! It was an engaging activity that helped the children further understand the properties of rocks. Well done Year 3 for your scientific curiosity!
