# **Enriching the Curriculum**

On Tuesday, Year 2 hosted a special event as part of their topic about pirates. Parents volunteered to be hands-on, helping the children build magnificent lighthouses using recycled materials. This was a fantastic opportunity to bring learning to life while promoting sustainability. This practical lesson full of creativity and teamwork sparked the children's imaginations and lead to discussions about

maritime adventures, the role of lighthouses in guiding ships and the importance of reusing materials in innovative ways.

Building on their autumn walk around the school grounds, Year 1

students have been studying autumn themed poems in English. using the book There is a Season by Murphy's Sketches as

inspiration. They have explored creative language, written their own poems, and illustrated them beautifully. The children have put in tremendous effort and produced fantastic work, including this lovely piece by Hollie from our Robins class.



Thank you to Michael's mum who visited Puffins and Owls on Wednesday. She is head of engagement and inclusivity at her work place and shared her expertise with the children in such a creative and engaging way. Using Tickles the tiger and Zebra as a visual and storytelling tool was a clever way to teach young minds
