This week, three local headteachers, who are part of our local Envision group, came into school. Envision focuses on improving teaching and learning for children in Bishop's Stortford. The focus of their visit was the development of vocabulary within the school. They visited lessons, spoke to staff and children and fed back to leaders about the positive practice that they saw as well as ideas for next steps. It is always beneficial to get others opinions on our practice to help us further develop.

Enriching the Curriculum

Northgate will celebrate Black History Month this October. In Monday's assembly, Mrs. Ahwe explained that the celebration began in 1926



with historian Carter G. Woodson, who sought to highlight the achievements of black, brown, and mixed heritage Americans. The UK has participated in Black History Month since 1987.

Throughout October, students will engage in various activities, learning about significant black, brown, and mixed heritage British people, both past and present. They will explore different music genres daily, focusing on the contributions of black artists. Special visitors will include Mr. Olusola Adebiyi, a storyteller and drummer, and Mr. Andrew Muhammad, "The Investigator," a leading expert in Black history and culture.

In English, students will read stories related to Black History Month, such as Coming to England by Floella Benjamin, celebrating the Windrush generation, and The Story of Ruby Bridges, which highlights her contributions to equality and education. Traditional African tales like Handa's Hen and The Spider Weaver: A Legend of Kente Cloth and many more. Hazal from Nightingales shared: "We learnt about Fleur East, a 36-year-old artist. Her mother is Ghanaian, and her father is English. Fleur is a rapper, songwriter and known for being on The X Factor and Strictly Come Dancing."

Additionally, there will be a poster competition over the half term, providing children with a fun opportunity to create and win exciting prizes!

Heritage and Cultural non-school uniform day

An evacuee from WW2 visits Year 5

Methuli and Daisy from Kites explained "Ruth, who is 92, came in and made a speech about how she was evacuated as a 6 year old child from Enfield during WW2. She was sent to a family in Hertfordshire along with her brother



and later joined another family in Yorkshire. Ruth's mother decided to bring them back home after a year. Her father was too old to fight for his country, but she remembers him building the family a underground Anderson Shelter in the garden to protect them. She explained that it was cold, damp and didn't smell very nice down there! In Enfield, they lived behind a railway station and one night, during an air raid, all the houses behind them were flattened. The class asked what it was like for Ruth during that time. She said that it wasn't very nice, but everyone just got on with it. Someone in the class asked her whether she ate food such as corned beef and Spam during the war. Ruth said she had it a lot! The class really enjoyed her visit and found her fascinating".

National Poetry Day 3rd October

Nightingale class wrote poems on the theme of Autumn. Alice J wrote "Autumn is wonderful, when all the leaves fall down all golden and brown. Autumn has the smallest breeze that lifts over all the trees. Sweets and treats on Halloween day, everyone can play". Brilliant work!
