Topic



Frozen Kingdom

Frozen Kingdom is a geography-based topic focused on the Arctic and Antarctic regions as well as the animals that live there. We link this topic to our English by re-telling the story of Ernest Shackleton's expedition to the Antarctic and reading Sky Song by Abi Elphinstone.

Fallen Fields



Fallen Fields is a historic topic studying World War 1. We will explore how the war started and ended and what life was like in the trenches.

Maths

This term we will be covering the following areas:

To read, write, order, compare and round numbers up to 10 000 000 and determine the value of each digit, including decimals. To use negative numbers in context. To be fluent in the mental recall of all times tables up to 12 x 12. To add, subtract, multiply and divide multi-digit numbers (including decimals) using the formal written methods., including long division and multiplication. KIRFS: Apply x and ÷ facts, including to decimals. Double and halve all numbers, including decimals.

PE Kit

Home Learning

Children are expected to read to an adult for 15 minutes at least 3 times a week in order to help them increase their vocabulary and deepen their understanding of the text. If your child is a fluent reader, please talk to them about the vocabulary and check their understanding of the text. Please sign in their reading record. If your child has lost or misplaced their reading record, please let us know as soon as possible. Spellings, based on the 'Read, write, inc' spelling scheme, are set on a weekly basis. Spelling scores are recorded in the home learning book each week by the pupils.

Tables up to 12 x 12 can be practised on a weekly basis using Timetables Rockstars.

Maths Key Instant Recall Fact (KIRFS) for the half term should be practised as much as possible so it becomes fluent.

Maths and English tasks are uploaded to **Google Classroom** on a Friday and need to be completed and returned by the following Wednesday. Sometimes, a topic based task will be sent home instead of English. These tasks should take approximately 30 minutes each.

Reading KS2

In class, we will be reading a range of texts, including **Sky Song** by **Abi Elphinstone**. All children have a reading record book, which they are expected to take home and bring into school daily. Teachers will check record books weekly in your child's guided reading sessions. Children may use school library books or bring in an age appropriate book from home. Please listen to your child read at least three times per week in order to help them increase their vocabulary and deepen their understanding of the text. If your child has lost or misplaced their reading record, please let us know as soon as possible.
